### **Orange County Board of Supervisors Approved Balanced \$9.5 Billion Tentative Budget**

(Santa Ana, CA) – At Tuesday’s annual budget meeting, the Orange County Board of Supervisors tentatively approved its budget for the next fiscal year. The County expects to receive final budget approval at the Supervisor’s June 25<sup>th</sup> meeting.

The \$9.5 billion budget, which adequately funds public safety and essential services, confirms the county’s ongoing commitment to fiscal responsibility and community safety. This budget reflects careful consideration of the county’s priorities and needs, ensuring that resources are allocated efficiently and effectively.

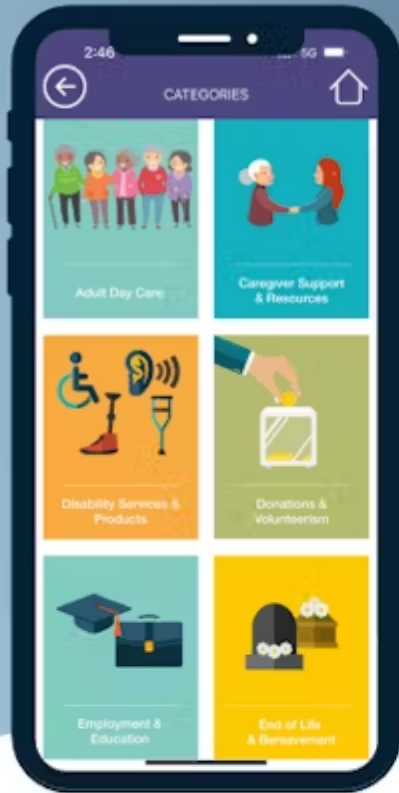

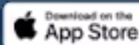
